A short History of Sports in Klang Club



Klang Club was founded in 1901 at the present location for the purpose of social and recreational activities of the colonial members. In the initial years of its founding and up to the beginning of the Second World War in 1941, the Klang Club was the focal point for sporting, social and cultural activities of the European community in Klang and the surrounding areas.

During the Japanese Occupation (1942-1945), the Klang Club was used as a recreational mess for Japanese army officers stationed in Klang and Port Swettenham.

Following the return of the British in 1945, it became once again the centre of European leisure time activities in Klang. Up to the attainment of independence by the Federation of Malaya in 1957, it remained a 'European Only' club whereby the members were European planters, businessmen, professionals, British Civil servants and British military personnel. The club was renowned for its sporting activities which included rugby, hockey, cricket and tennis. Although Europeans constituted the majority of team members, talented Klangites, especially schoolboys were included in the teams as 'associate' and 'junior' members. Cricket, in particular was popular and hardly a Sunday went by without a game being played at the padang. In the fifties and sixties, Klang Club organised an annual lawn tennis tournament usually during the Easter holidays. These tournaments, which were part of the Selangor Lawn Tennis Association calendar of events were popular and prestigious.

Beginning from 1957, the 'European Only' policy was gradually changed and carefully selected Malaysians were admitted as members. The 1970's witnessed a growth in membership as more professionals, businessmen, and civil servants from Klang were admitted as members. The construction of swimming pool and its annexe were completed in 1976. 1983 saw the extensive renovations to the Club house in the beautification of the redevelopment programme to establish the long term needs of members in relation to recreation, entertainment and sports. Five years later in 1988 the construction of the Squash/Gymnasium complex completed the present land-scape of Klang Club.

Today, Klang Club offers a comprehensive range of sports activities to the sports enthusiasts. Friendly matches with other clubs and organisations in the various sporting events are organised every now and then. Social games like Football, Hockey, Volleyball, cricket and Basketball played among Klang Club members are organised every year. Another major sports event hosted by Klang Club is the Six-a-side Inter-Club Hockey Tournament which is held annually. This year, thirty clubs participated in the hockey tournament. Klang Club has dominated the swimming arena for many years. The swimming pool has not only been a great source of pride but it has also produced many good swimmers who have represented the state and country. Sports members look forward to the Annual Individual Championship in tennis, Golf, Squash, Table-tennis, Billiard and Darts vying for the title of Champion so as to get their names imprinted in the Klang Club Roll of Honour.
