CELEBRATING RKC'S LEGACY OF DISTINCTION

INTERVIEW WITH RKC PRESIDENT KENNY LEE/BY S. JAYAKRISHNAN

ROYAL Klang Club President Kenny Lee reflects on the Club's upcoming 125th Anniversary celebrations, its significance and the rich legacy of Klang's most prestigious Club in an interview with our editor, S. Jayakrishnan.

THE Royal Klang Club marks another momentous and glorious chapter in the annals of its distinguished history as it celebrates its 125th Anniversary this year.

It is a truly significant and memorable occasion worthy of acknowledgment by its esteemed members. More than a familiar heritage landmark, RKC is no doubt an institution that has long held regal status and a reputation that transcends borders.

Officially established in 1901 as Klang Club, the Club – which shares historical links with the Selangor palace – has long since attained royal status, befitting RKC's prestigious and acclaimed status as Selangor's premier social and recreational Club.

RKC has come a long way since its early days when it was exclusively an enclave for British colonial era planters, the elite in Klang society and counted among its esteemed members during its inception the Sultan of Selangor and the then British Resident.

RKC president Kenny Lee, recently re-elected to a second term, says prestige and a distinguished status have long been distinctive hallmarks of the Club.

"We strive to preserve and uphold the prestigious legacy of RKC which every member of this Club should be proud of. It is by no means an ordinary Club but a revered institution and historic landmark whose links are closely intertwined with the royal city of Klang and the community," he says.

Kenny, who joined the Club in 1990, says it is incumbent on all members to uphold the proud ideals and traditions of the Club as it turns a pivotal chapter in its long and chequered history.

The RKC president says that His Royal Highness the Sultan of Selangor, the Club's Patron, has graciously accepted the Club's invitation to attend a dinner function to be held at the Club to mark the 125th Anniversary Celebration.

"We picked an appropriately themed tagline – Embracing A New Horizon – for the 125th Anniversary Celebration which signifies and exemplifies the Club's resilience and steadfastness. Over the passage of time, the Club has evolved, transformed and adapted to the changes and progress and we aim to move forward in keeping with the times."





He adds that the Club's Organising Committee for the 125th Anniversary Celebration has been working diligently to ensure a fun-filled and memorable occasion for members and their families as well as guests.

The organising committee, comprising a handful of those who helped to organise RKC's Centenary bash 25 years ago, was picked based on their experience and expertise in managing the event.

The Club hopes to entice more members to join the pro-tem organising committee to share their expertise and offer their service to ensure a successful and memorable event.

Kenny says as a renowned sports and recreational Club that has produced former Olympians and regional, national and state-level champions in hockey, cricket, squash, swimming, table tennis and athletics, one of the highlights of the programme will be a series of Inter-Club games with six affiliated Clubs in the peninsula.

The selected games, which include hockey, football, badminton, table tennis, pickleball, darts and pool, strive to boost the spirit of

fellowship, camaraderie and sporting spirit. Also included among the activities is a charity golf championship.

RKC's past presidents have been extended a special invitation to partake of the bash as a mark of respect and recognition of their selfless contributions to the Club. Several of them had even offered to assist the Club in organising the 125th Anniversary Celebrations as it marks a pivotal chapter in its history.

Kenny adds that the Club wishes to engage all members of RKC in the celebrations. Hence a Family Day and Fun Walk will be held to create a buzz among the Club's members, families and guests and ensure everyone joins in the revelry.

The highlight of the RKC 125th Anniversary Celebration will be a gala dinner to be held on Oct 10, 2026 with a special guest of honour to grace the occasion.

Recognising RKC's rich creative talent, an art competition with the theme of the 125th Anniversary was held with encouraging response from members and their children. Winners were accorded prizes in the various

categories and selected entries will be featured for merchandising in the form of T-shirts, caps and mugs to promote the celebrations.

As in the past, winning entries will be displayed at the Club's facilities.

The RKC president says members' response to the 125th Anniversary Celebration has been encouraging and so too the corporate sponsors approached to help ensure costs are kept within the budget.

"The General Committee aims to celebrate the occasion on a moderate but memorable scale."

Tentatively, the 125th Anniversary Organising Committee plans to launch a time capsule to commemorate the milestone. Selected items pertaining to the Club's history will be preserved in the time capsule with a plaque displayed to highlight the historic event.

Switching the topic to the everyday management of the Club, Kenny who has been in the "hot seat" for a second term says the past few years have been challenging.

The Club president says his GC has inherited "legacy issues" pertaining to the Club's ageing infrastructure particularly issues like roof leakage, termite infestation at the squash courts, toilet refurbishment and maintenance of the hot and cold contrast pools.

"We have addressed some of these issues as I promised when I took charge like the roof leakage, repairs to the squash courts and upgrading the piping system to the contrast pools.

"As for the toilet refurbishment project, which is a major job, we are in the midst of getting planning approval from the authorities, before we embark on it. We hope to see it completed soon."

To manage costs over the long run, solar panels have been installed on the roof of the Multi-Purpose Hall and LED lighting fitted wherever possible.

RKC has also shown its caring side by taking care of its staff, including those assigned to F&B, by ensuring their wages and benefits are reasonable and according priority to hiring local rather than foreign workers.

Staff also get two days off in conjunction with Workers Day where they are feted to show recognition of their services as well as being offered a bonus that is linked to their performance.

Addressing some concerns raised by members on the escalating costs of projects, Kenny shares that the GC should be given some leeway in carrying out its role.

"There are some infrastructure projects





that cannot be deferred as it may incur more costs the longer it is delayed or put off. As long as the GC sticks to its framework and parameters, there is no cause for any undue concern. Otherwise it only constrains us in undertaking urgent remedial measures."

As we usher in our 125th Anniversary, we must all strive to ensure our Club remains steadfast in our vision and stays on a firm financial footing, ready to embrace opportunities and navigate the challenges that lay ahead.

On the status of the Club's finances, Kenny, who has an extensive corporate background in banking and finance, is adamant that the Club should not have the misconception that it is flushed with funds simply because of its RM7 million in fixed deposit holdings.

Kenny adds that any call or suggestion to dip into its FD savings to defray costs of major projects and undertakings at RKC would be unwise and even perilous to its financial status in the long run.

"This is something all RKC members must understand and be cognisant of. The GC under my watch takes prudent management of the Club's finances very seriously.

As we usher in our 125th Anniversary, we must all strive to ensure our Club remains steadfast in our vision and stays on a firm financial footing, ready to embrace opportunities and navigate the challenges that lay ahead.

"With that I wish everyone at the Club a very happy 125th Anniversary and may we all continue to enjoy more great times at RKC."

WALTER SIM's update on RKC's INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT

MANY clubs prioritise comfortable and well-equipped changing rooms and washrooms to enhance the overall member experience.

These facilities often include amenities like private spaces, and even spa-like features to provide a relaxing and refreshing atmosphere before or after activities like workouts or swimming.

The members of the Royal Klang Club (RKC) can soon experience such comforts too as a RM1.5mil project has been proposed and approved at its premises.

The plan is to upgrade the washroom facilities, including replacing the flooring, tiling, ceiling, lighting and general plumbing repairs in the bathrooms located at The Lagoon and Multi-Purpose Hall building.

Another area that will be looked into is the Club's infrastructure, like the roofing near The Lagoon.

Most have used the toilet facilities at the Club and there have been countless questions on the lack of facilities or other problems.

Those often highlighted include low water pressure, insufficient hot water (suddenly turning from hot to cold), and a not so comfortable powder room.

All these will be addressed with the upcoming upgrading project.

At the RKC, the last major refurbishment of the toilet facilities at the Multi-Purpose Hall was in 2005 and at The Lagoon in 2007.

THE PROJECT

The foremost consideration for the upgrading and refurbishment of the facilities is to ensure enough cold water and hot water supply, and that the water storage heater is enough for usage at the facilities.

The sub-committee has proposed a dedicated water pipeline to channel cold water to two pressed steel tanks to cater to the toilets at the Multi-Purpose Hall and The Lagoon.

A storage water heater is also to be installed at each bath cubicle to minimise breakdown.

This way, if any one storage heater is faulty, only that particular bath cubicle is affected, not the rest.

Currently, at The Lagoon and Multi-Purpose Hall, there are only two storage water heaters to serve each facility.

In the event one breaks down, a section of the baths will not get enough hot water supply.

As the Multi-Purpose Hall toilets, both for male and female, are in a dilapidated condition, the plan involves a total reconstruction of the facilities.

The works include relocating the toilets for male patrons to the first floor of the Multi-Purpose Hall where the billiard and snooker room area there will be used with to provide more space. This expanded facility will have 10 baths compared with six now, three wash closets compared with two now and five urinals compared with the existing two.

Additionally, a new sauna to accommodate 10 individuals is proposed.

With this change, the current male toilet area will be converted for use by female patrons, consisting of five baths, three wash closets, four basins with a hair dryer each, a large mirror in the powder room and a sauna as well as a steam bath room with a capacity to fit six users.

Currently, there are only two baths and two wash closets.

The female members have voiced out that the sauna is not well utilised due to its dehydrating effects and that a steam bath is a better option. Hence the plan to include the latter.

At The Lagoon, the male toilets will comprise five baths, three wash closets and a toilet for the disabled complete with the necessary features.

For the women, there will be five baths, three wash closets, three basins with hairdryers each, a powder room with a large mirror and a disabled-friendly toilet.

The project sub-committee is also looking into providing lockers, rail hangers, benches and other items to enhance the facilities and provide comfort to users.

Sim, a building engineer, who is also the sub-committee project chairman, said the main focus is to be prudent with the allocated funds while ensuring the works carried out benefit the members.

Sim, a Club member, said the upgrades, user-friendly aspects and overall comfort of patrons were important factors for a Club with RKC's standing.

He said the roofing at The Lagoon area will also be looked into and, if necessary, replaced.

"The building was put up in the 1980s and while refurbishing, it will be good to look into the roof condition as well."

On the project status, Sim said the sub-committee has appointed an external party to carry out due diligence before awarding the contract. The external party will prepare the tender documents.

He said the external party will ensure those submitting tenders for the project were of equal standing, in terms of quality and costing.

The project, once awarded, is expected to be completed in nine months.

Our editor, S. Jayakrishnan, met up with K. Thavanesan, chairman of the Royal Klang Club's 125th Anniversary Celebration Organising Committee, to get an update on what the Club has lined up to mark this historic occasion.

The Royal Klang Club (RKC) celebrates a remarkable milestone next year — its 125th anniversary — a proud testament to the enduring legacy of Selangor's premier social and recreational institution.

This significant occasion marks not only another chapter in the Club's rich history but also a celebration of its community spirit. The organising committee has planned a series of exciting programmes and activities that will involve members, their families, the corporate sector, and the wider community.

K. Thavanesan, fondly known as Thava, a long-standing member since 1990, is leading the organising committee. He says the celebrations, beginning in March 2025, will focus strongly on sports — a fitting tribute to the Club's proud heritage.

"We are a renowned sports club not just in Selangor but throughout Malaysia, having produced many outstanding athletes, including Olympians," says Thava. "Sports will therefore be at the heart of our anniversary celebrations, which will kick off in October next year."

RKC plans to host a series of inter-club games with its affiliated clubs nationwide, including the Royal Selangor Club, Royal Sungai Ujong Club, Melaka Club, Royal Ipoh Club, Penang Sports Club, Royal Lake Club, and Selangor Coast Club.

The sporting events will feature a wide range of games such as hockey, cricket, football, table tennis, pickleball, tennis, badminton, darts, snooker, and pool. Matches will be held at RKC's own facilities as well as external venues including Bayumas Oval for cricket, the Pandamaran AstroTurf hockey field, Sultan Sulaiman Stadium for football, and other nearby sports arenas.





“Beyond the competitions, we’re expecting enthusiastic support from families, friends, and guests,” says Thava. “The goal is to create a festive atmosphere that everyone can enjoy.”

No stranger to major RKC events, Thava previously served two terms on the General Committee and played a key role during the Club’s Centennial Anniversary in 2001. He notes that the response from members, the corporate sector, and the Klang community has been very encouraging. To build excitement, a special anniversary logo featuring the tagline “Embracing A New Horizon” has been launched, with commemorative merchandise — including T-shirts, caps, mugs, and other collectibles — in the works.

“These items will make wonderful keepsakes,” says Thava. “Some will be limited editions, and we expect strong demand from members eager to own a piece of RKC history.”

The celebrations will culminate in a grand gala dinner in October 2026, with 15 tables reserved for corporate sponsors. “We’re confident of a strong turnout. It will be a

memorable night not only for RKC but for the entire Klang community,” Thava adds.

A comedy skit highlighting RKC’s colourful history is also being planned for the dinner. The committee invites members with creative flair and stage presence to take part. “RKC is home to many talented individuals,” says Thava.

“We’d love to showcase their abilities in a performance that our guests will remember for years to come.” On the sponsorship front, two major beverage companies have already expressed keen interest in coming on board, while several other corporate and community partners are expected to join in the celebrations.

To encourage participation across all age groups, the committee is also planning a Family Day and Fun Walk, reinforcing RKC’s reputation as a family-friendly Club. “We want everyone — especially children — to feel included. This is, after all, a celebration for all,” Thava emphasises.





He also took the opportunity to thank past RKC presidents and General Committee members for their continued support and contributions. "Their willingness to help is deeply appreciated. The strong bond between the GC, members, staff, and community is what makes RKC such a special place," he says.

As part of the Club's commitment to its staff, the committee is exploring the idea of allocating a portion of proceeds from the anniversary celebrations towards a staff retirement fund — a gesture to acknowledge their years of loyal service.

To preserve the Club's history for future generations, a time capsule project is also being planned. It will include artefacts and archival documents tracing RKC's evolution from its early colonial days to its present status as a distinguished royal club. The time capsule is expected to be opened 25 years from now, during RKC's 150th anniversary. Reflecting on his lifelong ties to both Klang and the Club, Thava expresses deep pride in how far both have come.

Their willingness to help is deeply appreciated. The strong bond between the GC, members, staff, and community is what makes RKC such a special place.

"We've come a long way. The 125th anniversary celebrates not just our legacy and transformation, but also our steadfast spirit in embracing new horizons," he says.

PICKLEBALL IS ALL THE RAVE AT RKC

When Sasi Nair took over as Pickleball Captain at RKC, he wasn't chasing a title—he was answering a calling. What began as a shared interest with his wife Padmini soon became a passion project.

“I wanted her to enjoy the Club more, and pickleball gave us that chance together,” said Sasi.

The captaincy was first suggested by RKC's Vice-President, but Sasi initially hesitated. He eventually stepped forward after giving it deep thought and recognising the sport's growing presence. “It felt like the right time to give back,” he said.

From day one, Sasi's goal was simple: get more members, especially seniors, onto the court. Many older members had ruled themselves out of sports—but pickleball was different. “It's not a high-skill or high-impact game. Anyone can play it.”

He jokingly added, “If you can swat a fly, you can play pickleball.”

That easygoing tone is part of what's made the sport so popular at RKC. Today, the section is the fastest-growing one in the Club, now nearing 200 members.

A big reason for the boom is the familyfriendly approach. “We encourage spouses and children to join in. It's fun and inclusive,” said Sasi.

New members are even joining RKC just to play on Club's resurfaced courts. To manage the surge in participation, Sasi introduced a paddle stacking system. It's a fair rotation where players take turns in sequence—no queue jumping. “It ensures everyone gets a shot.”

The section now runs three sessions daily to cater to all lifestyles. Morning for retirees, evening for semi-retirees and late night for competitive younger players. This structure has made it easier for everyone to find their rhythm.

RKC's recent resurfacing and repainting of all three courts boosted morale significantly. Bitumen flooring is gentler on joints, making the game even more accessible. “Frankly, our courts are far better than most commercially run venues out there,” Sasi noted.

Support from the Club's Vice-President and Sports Chairman Mr. Serjeet Singh and President Mr. Kenny Lee has been unwavering.

“They've been fantastic,” said Sasi. “Their belief in our vision has made all the difference.” Club courts now see action morning and night—something rare until recently.

The section has also completed three training modules under IPTPA-certified coach Edward Chan.

They have laid a strong foundation for both new and seasoned players.

“Our members are really engaged—these sessions have cleared up so much confusion,” said Sasi.

Exciting times lie ahead. A championship is set for July, followed by inter-club games in August. And in 2026, RKC will host a special Interclub Event to celebrate its 125th Anniversary. Five Clubs will join the event, including Royal Selangor Club and Penang Sports Club.

“Many are looking forward to it. It will be a showcase of sportsmanship and celebration,” said Sasi. As the host, RKC plans to make the event memorable, blending competitive play with camaraderie. “We hope all members come out to show their support and Club spirit.” Helping him steer the section is his wife, Padmini.

A seasoned athlete, she brings a wealth of experience from badminton, squash, netball, and athletics. She has also led sporting events as a Secretary and acting Chairlady in other Clubs.

“Involvement in sports is second nature to me,” said Padmini.

“Being part of the RKC Pickleball section allows me to support Sasi while doing something I love.” Together, the couple creates an energetic, organised, and welcoming environment.

Padmini and Sasi also shared that their love for sports runs deep—even within their family. Over the years, they have organised friendly tournaments among relatives, complete with trophies and medals. This deep-rooted sporting spirit that they now channel into building a vibrant pickleball community at RKC.

Asked to sum up the section in one phrase, Sasi didn't hesitate: “Club Spirit.”

“Because what we've built here isn't just a sports group—it is a community.”

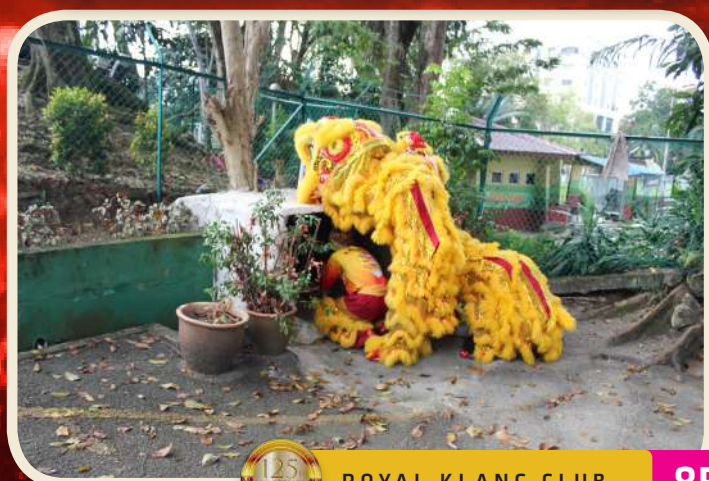

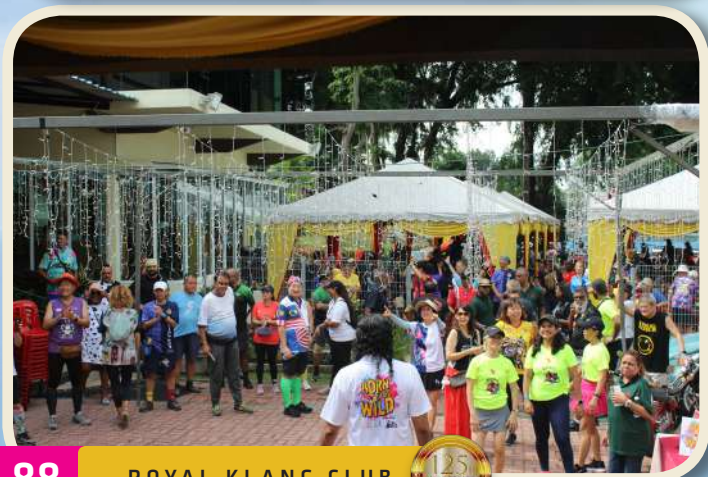
